

The Director of Property and Maintenance and the on-site Camp Caretaker will ensure that the camp site and physical plant are kept clean and in good repair.

9.1 Hazardous or Poisonous Material Policy

Objectives:

- All hazardous and/or poisonous materials (e.g. paint, abrasive cleaners, weed killer, etc.) stored or used on or around the RLUCC property are the responsibility of and are under the care and control of the Camp Caretaker who is trained in the handling of such materials.
- Hazardous or poisonous materials must be kept locked in the shed beside the on-site Caretaker's house which is across the lake from the camp and well out of reach of any campers.
- Where practical, hazardous or poisonous materials should be used while the camp is closed but, if this is not possible, at all times must be under the care and control of the Camp Caretaker, who must inform the Camp Director of any potential danger spots to avoid and must post appropriate signs and barricades to keep people out of the area.
- In all cases the disposal of any hazardous or poisonous material will be carried out in accordance with the regulations and legislation enacted by the Government of British Columbia and/or the Government of Canada.
- Bleach, cleaners, etc. required at camp should be stored out of reach of campers and, if necessary, locked away.
